*Church Maintenance - Repairs:

As we had announced & informed everyone at our previous Assemblies, we need to replace the Dome trim and Building trim which has rotted. In addition we need to wash the shingles, replace some that are damaged or missing & paint the outside of our building. Also the oak doors will be washed, sanded & refinished.

*Festival Equipment:

A refrigerator has broken down & needs to be replaced.

Also one serving line has rusted and also needs to be replaced.

*Security Monitoring System:

As explained & broken into its parts on the Costs page.

We have added this item since our Church Security concerns are increasing as with the whole country.

Sundays in Lent

April 7: Sunday of The Cross

On the Third Sunday of Lent the Cross is placed before us in the center, adorned with flowers, for inspiration and encouragement. This is Mid Lent.

In Orthros/ Matins we hear, "Behold! Through the Cross joy has come into all the world." The Cross is the sign of victory and life. It is the Way of the Resurrection. For this reason we sing on this Sunday: "Before Your Cross we bow down and worship, O Master, and Your Holy Resurrection we glorify."

If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself, carry his cross & come follow Me. (Mt 16:24)

April 14: Sunday of St. John of the Ladder

St John is the author of *The Ladder of Divine Ascent* and abbot of St. Catherine's Monastery on Mt. Sinai.

He outlines the steps in the Spiritual Warfare, the struggle from being "self-centered" to "God-centered". From "looking down" to "looking up", from the "fogginess of the passions which push us to sin against God & neighbor", to "clarity of the Light to help us understand and become merciful". What we see all around us.

April 21: Sunday of St. Mary the Egyptian

St. Mary was a prostitute in Alexandria. She went on a trip to Jerusalem. When she came to the Lord's Tomb (a "popular" destination for pilgrims), she could not enter! Our Lord literally confronted her with her sinfulness, & then she confronted herself. She realized who she truly was and made the decision to change - REPENTANCE! She ran from her sinfulness and devoted the remainder of her life (38 years) to live in the desert of the western side of the Jordan river.

Repentance is not only possible, it is the only way, for all. It is a turning to a different direction in your life, since the direction travelled so far has not been fruitful but rather destructive!

April 27: Saturday of Lazaros

On the day before the "Entry into Jerusalem" the Lord raised Lazaros from the dead, on the 4th day! This prepares us for the Passion, the death and Resurrection of the Lord.

April 28: PALM Sunday - ENTRANCE OF THE CRIST INTO JERUSALEM

This is the "triumphal" entrance into the Holy City of David. Jesus comes as a "King of kings" and "Lord of lords" since He now has power even over death (Lazaros). But His kingdom is not merely of this earth, we proceed into Holy Week to show that God is Love. For He is led to the slaughter as the "spotless" Lamb and He accepts it, truly the Love of the enemy!

Is there anyone here who is a devout lover of God?

Let them enjoy this beautiful bright festival.

Is there anyone who is a grateful servant?

Let them rejoice and enter into the joy of their Lord!

Eligibility:

High School Senior and College Student of Greek descent or a Phil-Hellene actively involved in our Maine Greek Communities. Priority will be given to High School Seniors. If there are no High School Seniors, preference will be given to 1st year College students.

Application must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than May 15, 2024. First time applicants will only be considered.

The applicant must be enrolled in a higher education institution.

Requirements:

Completed application package must be postmarked by May 15, 2024 and include the following:

- Cover letter introducing student including church community affiliation/involvement, special interests, awards, recognitions.
- The applicant should have his institution mail to the Scholarship Committee a transcript with a GPA of 85% or higher.
- Two recommendation letters from parish priest, mentor, supervisor (work or community service), teacher or athletic coach.
- 4. 250-word essay on the topic "If you are the mayor of your city how would you address the homeless problem?"
- 5. Copy of College acceptance letter
