## GOD BLESS AMERICA. LET US NEVER FORGET ... SEPTEMBER 11, 2001

The **September 11 attacks** (also referred to as **9/11**) were a series of four coordinated <u>terrorist attacks</u> by the <u>Islamic terrorist group Al-Queda</u> against the United States on the morning of Tuesday, September 11, 2001. The attacks <u>killed 2,996 people, injured over 6,000 others</u>, and caused at least \$10 billion infrastructure and property damage. Additional people died of related cancer and respiratory diseases in the months and years following the attacks.

9/11 is the single deadliest terrorist attack inhuman history and the single deadliest incident for <u>firefighters and law enforcement officers in the history of the United States</u> with 343 and 72 killed, respectively.

Former New York Governor George Pataki, who was in office during 9/11, said during the groundbreaking "that the church is a missing piece in the efforts to rebuild Ground Zero. It was the city-states that gave us our belief today in freedom," he said. "It will now be the Greek Orthodox Church that is the rock of faith that anchors all that is done here at Ground Zero."

# 14th of September the Finding of the Holy Cross

by the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine - queen & the Equal to the Apostles Helen

Two events are commemorated: The finding of The Holy Cross and the return of The Cross from Persia to Jerusalem.

In the Holy Land, the Empress Helen searched for The Cross of Christ. It was revealed that the Cross was buried under the temple of Venus that Emperor Hadrian had built on Golgotha. Three crosses were found. The archbishop & patriarch Macarius of Jerusalem told them to have a sick woman touch the crosses, when The Cross was touched she became well.

The patriarch elevated the Cross for all the people to see, and the people sang with tears: "Lord, have mercy!" This is exactly what we do in church as a commemoration of this day.

Also small leafed basil was growing in the area, thus we use it to this day!

Later, the Persian Emperor Chozroes conquered Jerusalem, enslaved many people, and took the Lord's Cross to Persia. The Cross remained in Persia for fourteen years. In the year 628 the Roman Emperor Heraclius defeated Chozroes and returned the Cross to Jerusalem. As he entered the city Emperor Heraclius desired to carry The Cross on his back, but suddenly he was unable to take another step. Patriarch Zacharias instructed the emperor to remove his royal raiment and, in ragged attire and barefoot, he carried it to Golgotha, placed it in the Church of the Resurrection.

Also on this day: We also celebrate the Roman Empress, St. Placilla, who was the wife of Emperor Theodosius the Great. In mind and deed, she was a true Christian. She was especially distinguished for helping the needy and the sick. When some people told her that this was not consistent with imperial dignity, she replied: "It becomes the imperial calling to assist with money; however, in my personal efforts concerning the poor, I give to Him who deigned to give me this calling." She rested in the Lord in 400AD.

Also on this day: Our Holy Father John Chrysostom archbishop and patriarch of Antioch & Constantinople fell asleep in the Lord. His actual day of celebration was moved to November 13.

#### The Search for Christ

### **KEEP THE FAITH!**

"In truth, God is everywhere. But where will we find Him? Is there nothing left for us to do but mourn with Mary Magdalene, crying: 'They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they laid Him' [John 20:13]? Our sins have removed the Lord from us, and we do not know where to seek Him. Someone may object: 'The Lord is with me, and I with Him. Because I believe in Him, and I pray and worship Him.' O if only the Lord arranged things this way — that He is with every Christian who prays and worships Him. Behold, it is not enough for salvation to only believe in Christ. As the holy Apostle James says: 'The demons believe, and tremble' [James 2:19]. But our current issue is not with the demons. What profit is there for a Christian to believe in Christ, and yet lack Christian works? What use is there to pray to Christ, while trespassing His commandments? What is it to worship Christ, while grieving Him with lawless deeds? ... You pray to Christ, and then spit in His face — through your cursing, and through your disdain and judgment of your neighbor... If, as you claim, Christ is with you and you with Him, then prove it with your life. As the Apostle says: 'Show me your faith ... by [your] works' [cf. James 2:18]."

#### Gospel Reading, from the Gospel according to John 10:17-28

The Lord said to the Jews who came to him, "For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life, that I may take it again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again; this charge I have received from my Father."

There was again a division among the Jews because of these words. Many of them said, "He has a demon, and he is mad; why listen to him?" Others said, "These are not the sayings of one who has a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"

It was the feast of the Dedication at Jerusalem; it was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered round him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly." Jesus answered them, "I told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me; and I give them eternal life."

# **Building Maintenance Update!**

Everything stopped during the Festival period.

- 1. The "washing" is completed. It has been paid for. \$4,600.
- Soon the trim/shingles <u>repair/painting</u> will begin. The Church painting began in May and is 50% complete to date. Proposed trim replacement work where it's needed will begin this month. (Initial painting installment payment \$8,500.)
- 3. Our kitchen/Festival refrigerator/serving line has been bought & paid for.
- Security <u>Monitoring System</u>: we have paid a deposit for the work to begin. Monitoring system was installed in June and has been paid in full. \$6,450. We added an additional monitor in Youth Space from original proposal.

<u>The expenses</u>: At our General Assembly on April 14<sup>th</sup>, we voted to spend up to \$90,000, this included a contingency.

- We received an anonymous \$12,000 donation/gift to cover the refrigerator/serving line replacement cost!
- Again to remind everyone: The Lacones are donating \$30,000 towards this work! Pretty incredible!
- So far we have spent: <u>\$19,550</u>.
