UNDERSTANDING THE NATIVITY FAST IN THE CHURCH

The Nativity Fast, a beautiful and spiritually enriching time in the Orthodox Christian Church, prepares us for the joyous celebration of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. This period is steeped in tradition and offers a wonderful opportunity to deepen our faith and reflect on the true meaning of Christmas.

WHAT IS THIS FAST?

The Fast, is one of the canonical fasting seasons in the Church. Its roots can be traced back to the early Christian Church, with references found in both the Old and New Testaments. This period prepares us for the Feast of the Nativity of Christ.

Historically, it was established to mirror the 40-day fast of Moses on Mount Sinai before receiving the Ten Commandments (Ex 34:28). It also reflects the 40 days Christ fasted in the desert before beginning His public ministry (Mat 4:1-11). These biblical references underscore the importance of fasting as a means of drawing closer to God, and struggling with drawing closer to the Creator, through the cleansing our bodies and souls, and preparing for significant spiritual events.

Since the Nativity is a joyous event, this Fast is much more lax, even joyous one can say.

Christ is Born!



A quick word about the Fast.... from St John Chrysostom:

....abstaining from food during this period of preparation does us no good if we do not also:

"... the eye and the ear and the feet and the hands and all the members of our bodies.

Let the hands fast, by being free of avarice.

Let the feet fast, by ceasing to run after sin.

Let the eyes fast, by disciplining them not to glare at that which is sinful.

Let the ear fast, by not listening to evil talk and gossip.

Let the mouth fast from foul words and unjust criticism.

For what good is it if we abstain from meats and fishes, but bite and devour our brothers?"

Notes (December 2024)

THE NATIVITY FAST, ADVENT

The 40 days end on December 24 (January 6)

The Christmas Fast is similar to that of the Apostles' Fast in June. We abstain from meat and dairy products.

The custom is to begin every day with a little Holy Water & Antidhoron, if we are NOT attending Liturgy. (Pick up at the church.)

On Wednesdays and Fridays we also do not eat fish, olive oil and wine. On the other days, it is permitted to eat fish along with o/o and wine. During the last 12 days preceding Christmas the fast become stricter; we completely abstain from fish.

Daily Liturgies

As we do every year, starting Dec 1, we again will begin the daily Liturgies in our side chapel of the Life Giving Spring.

We need: The Offering/Prosforo every day; **NO** wine; **EXTRA** Large CANDLES \$9 a piece (a total of about a dozen – NOT the large ones @ the Pangari - ask Fr Basil OR in the office).

Time: At **8:15am** we will read the First Hour (about 15-20 min), then begin the Liturgy. Check the Calendar...



ALBANIAN CHURCH CALLS FOR IMMEDIATE CEASEFIRE IN GAZA

The Albanian Orthodox Church, headed by His Beatitude Archbishop Anastasios, issued a statement on the war in Gaza.

The warring parties must give up repeated retaliations and work for an immediate ceasefire, the Church states:

The atrocities in Gaza, with tens of thousands of victims, mostly innocent civilians, children, the elderly, the sick, are causing deep suffering. There is a need to achieve an immediate ceasefire. The parties involved must show prudence and reasoning, prioritizing the value of each human being and peaceful coexistence over continued violence with incalculable consequences. Repeated retaliation does not solve the problem. All major powers must contribute to the way out of this catastrophic human and ecological tragedy.
